

Title I Reading

Tips to make the most of your reading with your child

We want to partner with you and your child to make the most of your learning time while we are apart. We have worked to provide you with materials that can be helpful to work with your child at home. We tried to include some of the learning routines we use daily in our Title I learning time.

- Watch a phonology video lesson-this allows your child to interact with and change sounds within words
- Use the deck of letter cards to practice sounds
- Use letter deck to sound out and blend words (non-sense words)
- Have your child read a poem from their poetry book:
 - Look for vowel patterns that they recognize
 - Find rhyming words and patterns
 - Talk about what a poem might mean or why it was written
 - Have your child illustrate the poem
- Use books that your child has brought home in their reading bags each week to share and enjoy together. Your child can write about their stories in the writing book that was included for first and second graders with their take home materials. Kindergarten received a packet of writing pages.
