## **MEETING MINUTES**

## PRELIMINARY MATTERS

## **BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS/ REAL ESTATE COMMITTEE**

Mr. Clendennen announced that VEBH will present proposed project drawings to the Board in February.

Mr. Clendennen introduced Mr. Dan Engen and Mr. Tom Durkin from VEBH who were present to explain the change orders proposed below.

Mr. Clendennen moved and Mr. Inman seconded a motion to accept a change order from Allegheny City Electric in the amount of \$25,521.85 to purchase, install and connect a Current Transformer cabinet as required by Penn Power to energize switch gear at the Middle School. Mr. Fleischman was unhappy with the change order and expressed the opinions that someone dropped the ball, the District should not have to pay for this and someone should tell Penn Power that they should find a less expensive solution. Mr. Engen replied that Penn Power was sent the drawings but did not respond quickly and they can do as they desire. Three options were examined and the cheapest recommended. Because this was addressed earlier in the project, VEBH is not charging for their time to redesign, etc. Mr. Calabria asked about the three options explored. Mr. Clendennen asked that three options be explained and Mr. Engen did so and stated that the least expensive was being proposed. Mr. Fleischman asked if there would be any more high cost change orders and Mr. Engen said that it is impossible to see what is under ground or behind walls, but once the new work is out of the ground and demo is completed, the risk is reduced.

Mr. Clendennen moved and Mr. Inman seconded a motion to approve two right of way agreements with Verizon for underground telecommunications lines.

Mr. Clendennen moved and Mr. Calabria seconded a motion to Yarborough Development, Inc. for roof insulation to accommodate two additional drains on the new gym roof at the Middle School in the amount of \$3,930.51. Mr. Engen explained that the roof was redesigned to slope in two directions rather than one, but the additional drains needed because the changes were left out of the revised plans.

## **POLICY COMMITTEE**

Mr. Heckathorn discussed a recommendation from Mr. Inman concerning changing Board policy in reference to Board members assignments to committees and recommended the first official reading be done at the next meeting. Mr. Calabria asked Mr. Inman to explain his proposal. Mr. Inman replied that his proposal followed Robert's Rules of Order and simply codified what the Board had done in the past in regard to assigning members to the various committees. Mr. Calabria thanked Mr. Inman. Mr. Oswald stated that the make up of the Negotiations Committee and the Buildings and Grounds Committee were previously approved by the Board, but Mr. Inman said he felt clarification was needed. Mr. Fleischman asked if membership was limited to three and Mr. Oswald said no. Mr. Fleischman said he feared things might become more political if committees were only three. Mr. May replied that he liked three on a committee because if a committee voted to recommend something to the Board as a whole, the committee members must support the committee's recommendation and four would make it harder for the rest of the Board to defeat a committee proposal. Mr. Inman said his proposal does not limit the committees to only three. Mr. Clendennen clarified that on the Buildings and Grounds Committee no votes are never taken, just recommendations made to the whole Board, and therefore committee members can vote as they please during Board votes. He agreed with Mr. Inman's recommendation. Mr. Fleischman stated that although he feels the committee's are not political, he does not want the opportunity to exist. He recommended that the wording of Mr. Inman's proposal add an "s" to "member" so more than three could be appointed to a committee when desired.
